1	<p>Flemish Sky -Medium (10-12" tall, 20" wide). Grey-blue wavy rippled pointed leaves. The blooms poke out through the leaves like a Florists' arrangement & attract hummingbirds! Slug resistant.</p>		\$4.00
2	<p>Ginko Craig -small (6" tall, 12" wide). Narrow grass green leaves with crisp white margins. Vigorous. A good plant for ground cover, edging, accent plantings & containers. Adjacent plants mesh, leaving no room or light for weeds</p>		\$2.50
3	<p>Blue Angel - Large (32" high, 70" wide.) Holds blue green color very well on huge leaves. Very Large mound; White flowers mid- summer. Excellent slug resistance.</p>		\$2.50

4	<p>Sum & Substance –Yellow</p> <p>-36" Tall, 72" wide. Wavy chartreuse foliage is corrugated and cupped. Can be enormous (9' wide at maturity). Lavender flowers mid – summer. Slug resistant. Sun tolerant</p>		<p>\$2.50</p>
<p>Astilbes –Adapted to shade & moist areas i.e.; woodland, pond-side planting. Deer & rabbit resistant. Tolerates clay soil.</p>			
5	<p>Queen of Holland</p> <p>-75cm, showy white flowers on glossy bronze foliage, late spring</p>		<p>\$2.00</p>

<p>10</p>	<p>Baptisia Australis</p> <p>Plants form a tall bushy clump of grey green foliage with tall spikes of violet blue pea-like flowers. Full Sun. Ht -36"</p>		<p>\$2.75</p>
<p>11</p>	<p>Ligularia Othello</p> <p>Clump forming perennial with large toothed green leaves. Yellow orange daisy like flowers 2-4" across. Shade. Needs moist soil.</p> <p>Petasites Giganteus (Giant Japanese Butterbur) Up to 5 feet high with 3-foot-wide leaves resembling rhubarb. It likes sun to part shade and moist to wet soil but will grow in an average garden.</p> <p>The flowers emerge before the leaves — think hyacinths but mutant ones with greenish blooms on naked stems. A bold, textural plant, it needs lots of room for best foliage effect. Place carefully: this is one plant that you don't want to make too happy. Petasites can spread quickly in moist locations and is difficult to control once it spreads. They can be grown in large pots or in less moist areas to restrict growth, or spreading can be controlled by sinking a heavy plastic or metal tub into the ground and placing the plant within.</p>	 	<p>\$2.25</p> <p>\$2.75</p>

<p>13</p>	<p>Filipendula Rubra</p> <p>Ht: 4-5 feet, 'Cotton Candy' pink plumes in June-July. Spreads by rhizomes, great for naturalizing in moist meadows. Full sun</p>		<p>\$2.75</p>
<p>14</p>	<p>Liatris Kobold</p> <p>Ht: 60cm, low clumps of grassy looking leaves bearing spikes of bright magenta- purple flowers in mid-summer. Full sun. Attracts butterflies/hummingbirds. Rabbit and deer resistant</p>		<p>\$2.25</p>

<p>15</p>	<p>Ruffled Velvet</p> <p>Ht:24-30"- Velvety dark purple</p>		<p>\$2.00</p>
